The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

Amended entry in the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 hereby amends the entry in the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

The monument known as **St Duthus's Chapel, Tain** comprises a medieval chapel likely to date from the 13th century. The two gables and the north wall stand almost complete to wall-head. The chapel lies on a small knoll in St Duthus Cemetery to the east of Tain, near where the River Tain enters the Dornoch Firth. It lies about 5m above sea level.

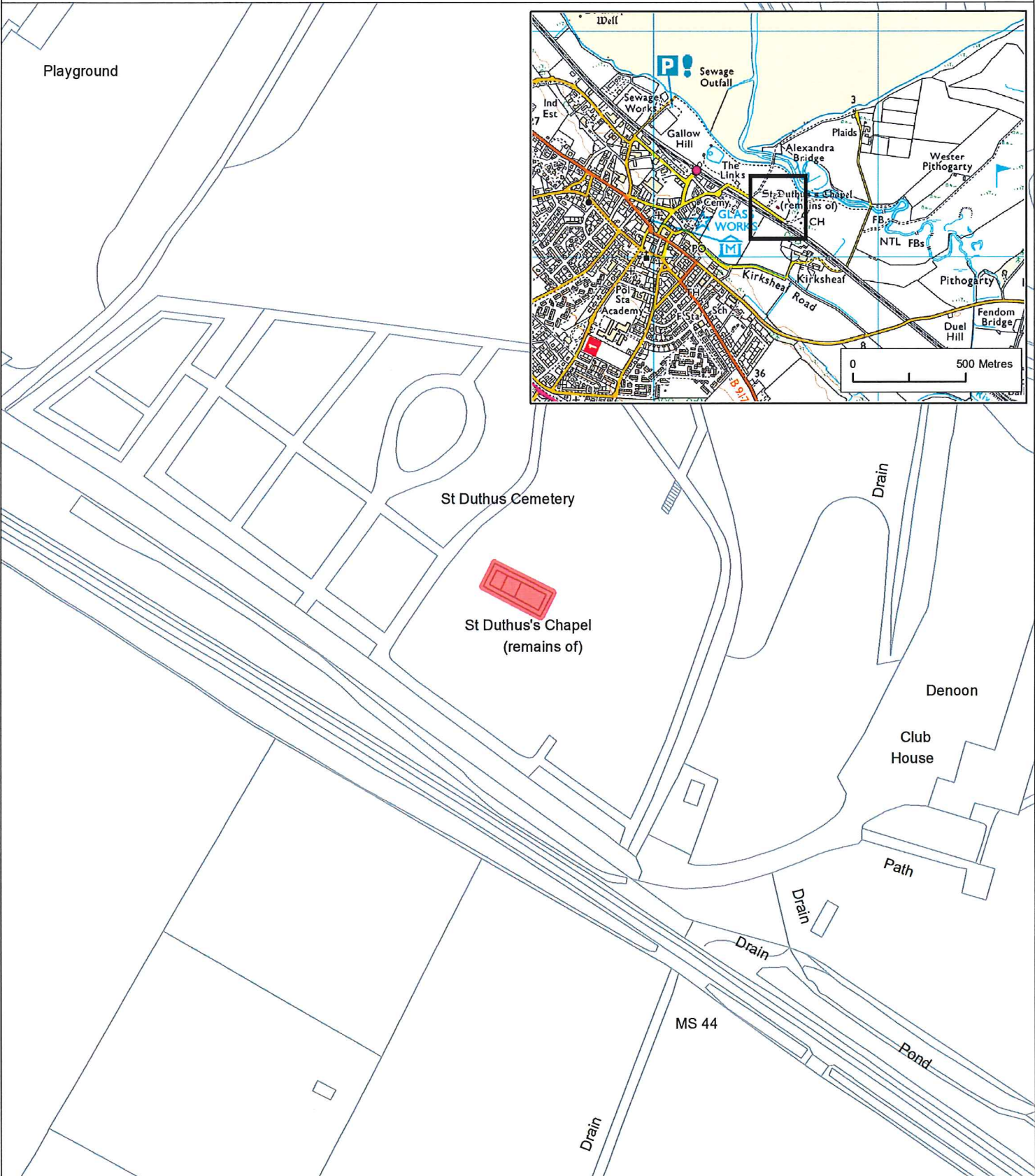
The scheduled area is rectangular on plan and includes the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive. The scheduled area excludes any railings, grave markers, headstones, memorial plaques and burial lairs.

The monument, which lies in the Parish of Tain and the County of Ross and Cromarty as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

This entry supersedes the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments for the monument known then as **St Duthus's Chapel** as referred to in the Certificate of Service of Notice by the Secretary of State for Scotland in respect of the monument dated 1 December 1975 and recorded in the General Register of Sasines for the County of Ross and Cromarty on 16 December 1975.
