### The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

#### Addition to the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 hereby adds to the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

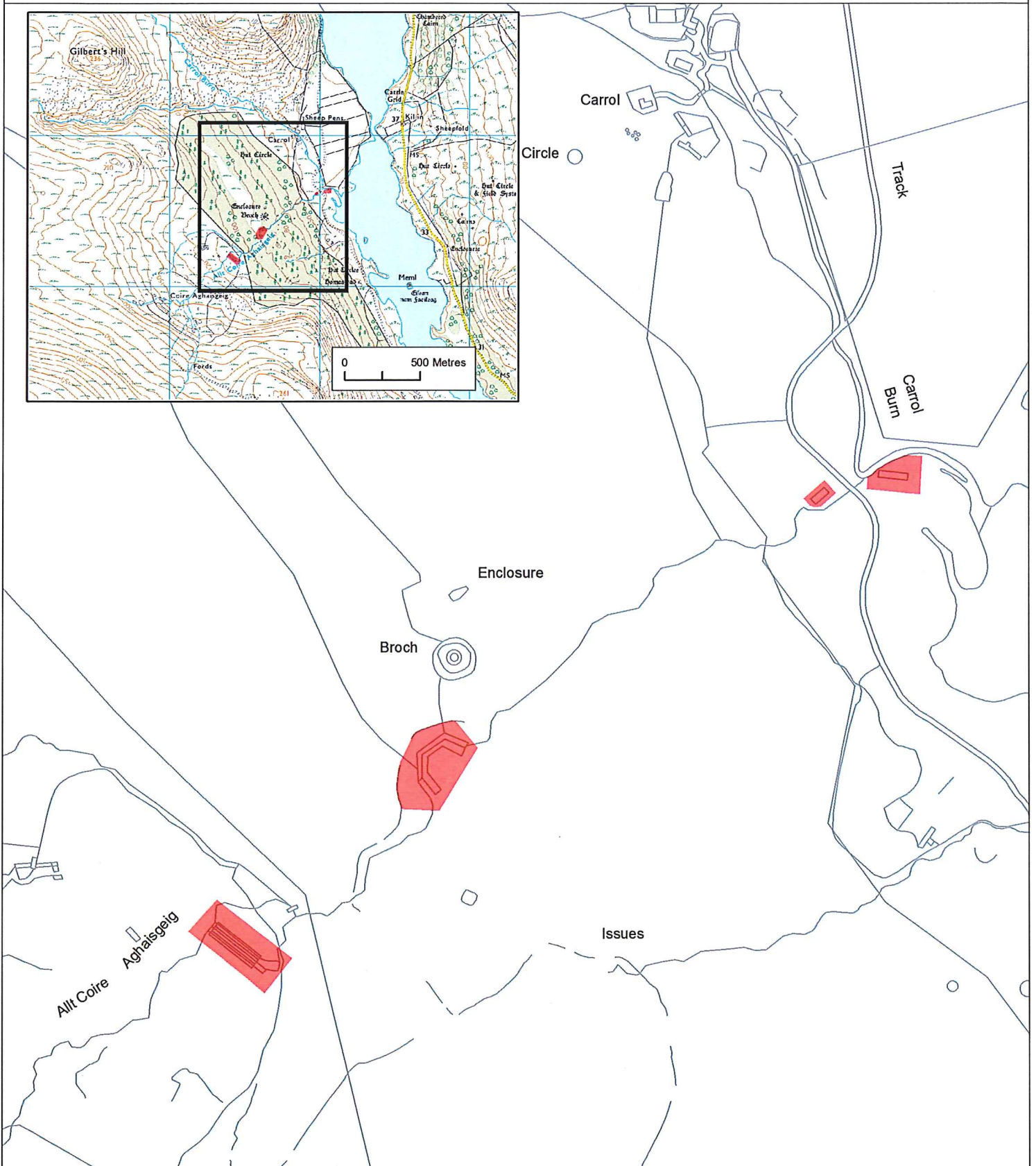
The monument known as **Carrol, fish farm 430m SE, 410m SSE, 660M and 890m SSW of** comprises a late 19th century fish farm, visible as the earthwork remains of three groups of artificial ponds with feeder and collector lades, set around 220m and 470m apart along the Allt Coire Aghaisgeig, along with the footings of a rectangular building. The monument is located on the hillside on the western side of Strath Brora, between about 30m and 100m above sea level.

The scheduled area is in four parts, one of which is rectangular in plan and the others irregular, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive.

The monument, which lies in the Parish of Clyne and the County of Sutherland as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.
