Description of Work

Undertake powerline maintenance and pole replacement works along circuit section under proposed and controlled electrical circuit shutdown on pole 10820916.

Pole 10820916 work detail:

1. Erect single HV pole, up to and including 12m pole - requires excavations.
2. Recover single pole, up to and including 15m in height and reinstate all ground conditions - requires excavations.
3. Erect/replace stay complete including block or driven type anchor - requires excavations.
4. Erect fuse units at single tee off pole or in line pole.
5. Erect single crossarm to single pole.

To complete works of these nature requires at most one day at each location.
