Replacement of existing gully at base of stone channelled burnlet to rear of Governor's House with two gullies to alleviate flooding surcharges. Existing gully drain is not coping with increasingly severe climate events.					

5 Description of proposed works					
New Gully Drains- Carefully dig up New Gully Drains- Carefully dig up (in dry weather) and remove existing granolithic concrete slab gully, maintaining existing outlet drain for continuing drainage (drainage pump may be required). Work to be carried out under archaeological monitoring (although work is in previously disturbed ground i.e. previous drain installed). Install 2no. new gully pots (with silt traps) connected to existing drain with new drain branches. Gullies bedded in new concrete					

benching/surround. Install new dished stone slabs as gully apron to channel surcharge events. All as detailed in drawing no.193-107-535
