The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

Amended entry in the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 hereby amends the entry in the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

The monument known as **Cairn of Shiels, cairn** comprises the remains of a burial cairn dating from the Bronze Age (between 2500BC and 800BC). It is visible as a circular mound of turf and stone measuring around 20.5m in diameter and 1.5m in height. The monument lies on a prominent ridge on the summit of Hill of Garvock, at about 260m above sea level.

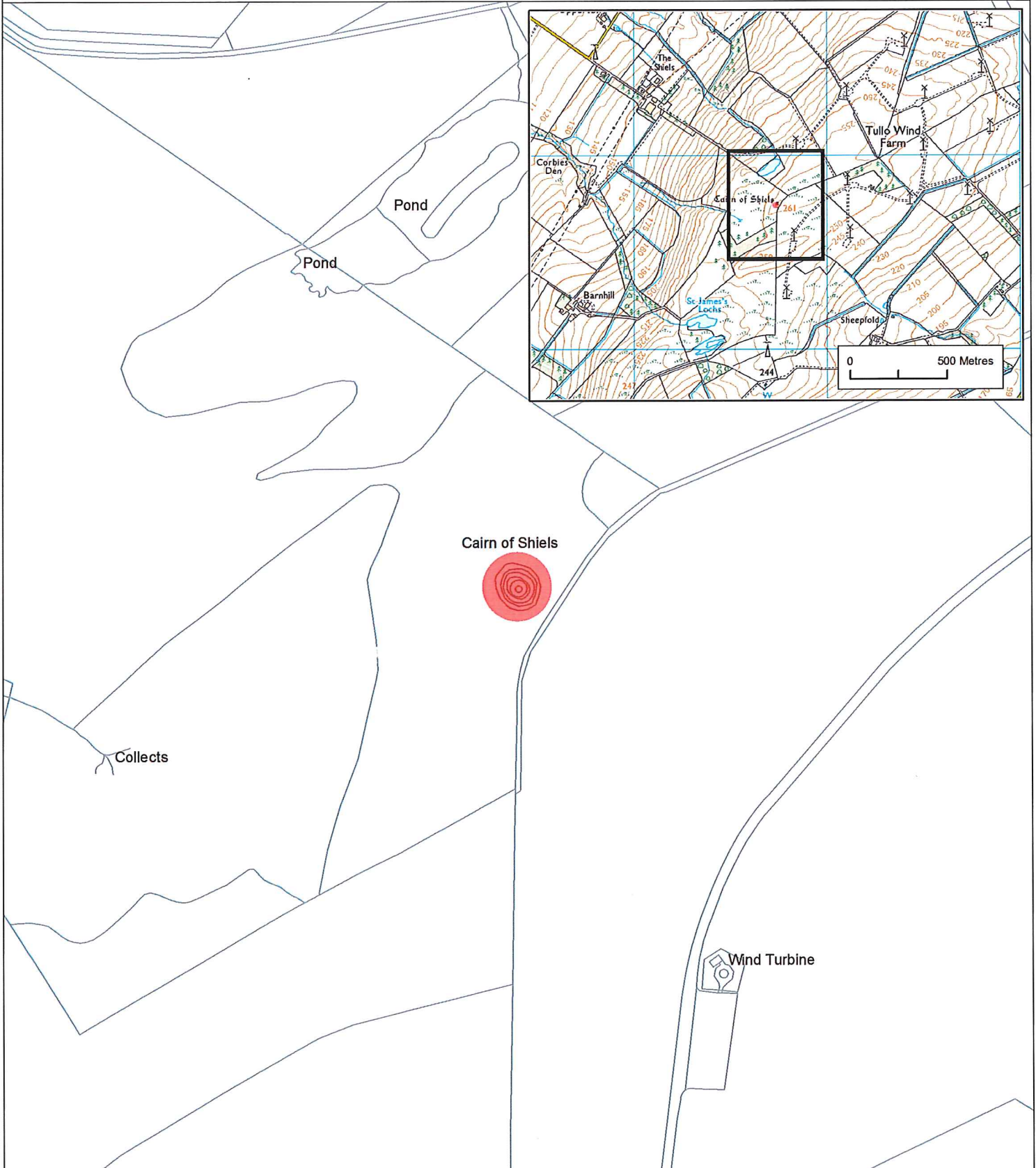
The scheduled area is circular on plan, measuring 33m in diameter, centred on the cairn, to include the remains described above and an area around them within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive.

The monument, which lies in the Parish of Garvock and the County of Kincardine as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

This entry supersedes the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments for the monument known then as **Cairn of Shiels, cairn** as referred to in the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments by the Secretary of State for Scotland in respect of the monument dated 9 March 1992 and recorded in the General Register of Sasines for the County of Kincardine on 25 August 1992.
