The Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979

Amended entry in the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979 hereby amends the entry in the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

The monument known as **Buaile Ormacleit, settlement** comprises the remains of a settlement mound, probably dating to the Iron Age (between 600BC and AD 400) and five sheiling huts, all constructed on or very close to the mound and of likely 17th or 18th century date. The monument lies on the edge of a valley-side terrace, about 60m above sea level.

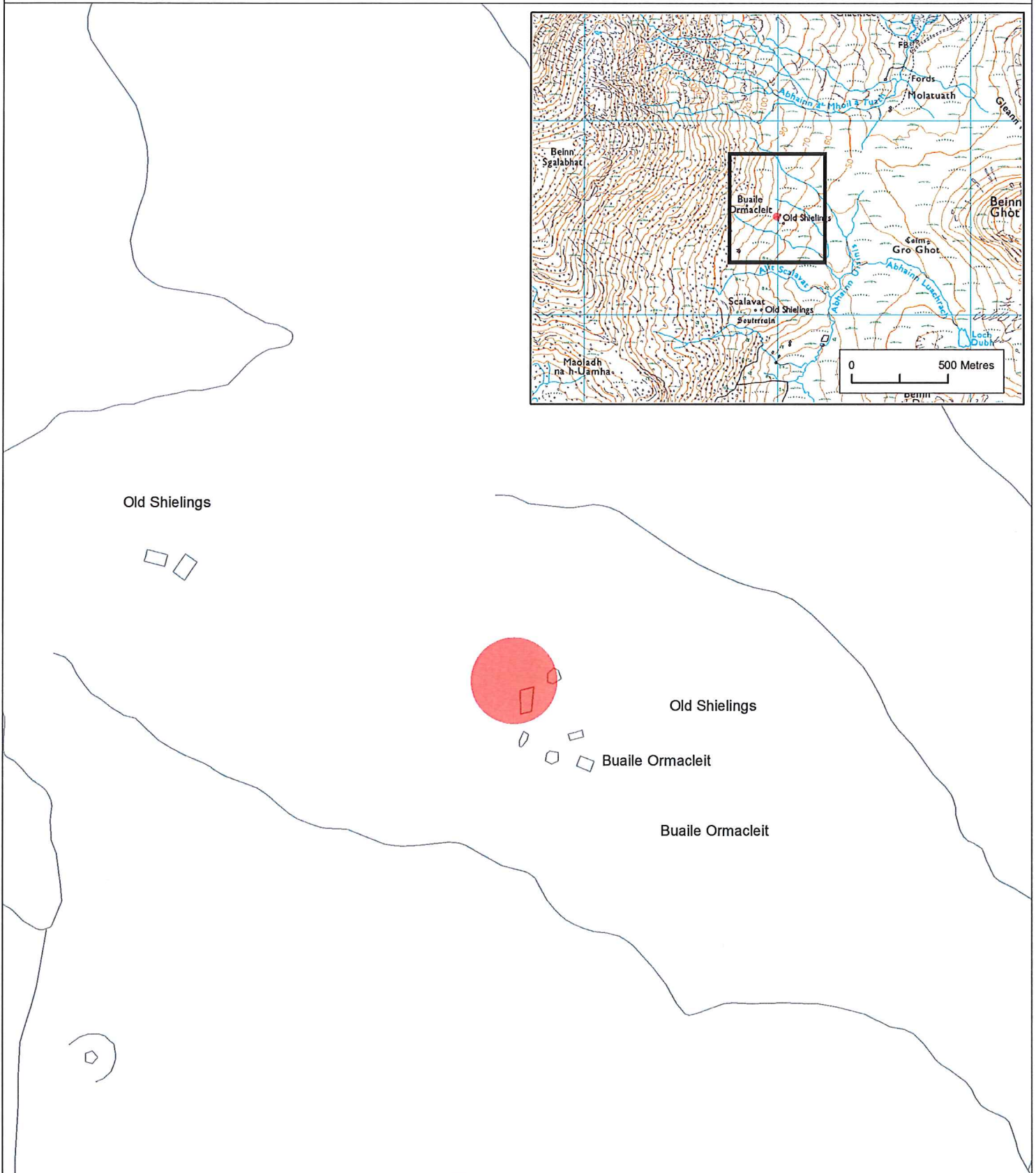
The scheduled area is circular on plan, measuring 40m in diameter, centred on the top of the mound to include the remains described above and an area around within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive

The monument, which lies in the Parish of South Uist and the County of Inverness as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.

This entry supersedes the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments for the monument known then as **Buail Ormaclett, souterrain and settlement, Usinish** as referred to in the Entry in the Schedule of Monuments by the Secretary of State for Scotland in respect of the monument dated 16 November 1993 and recorded in the General Register of Sasines for the County of Inverness on 18 January 1994.
