Addition to the schedule of monuments

Historic Environment Scotland, in exercise of the powers conferred on it by section 1(3) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979, hereby adds to the statutory schedule of monuments as set out below.

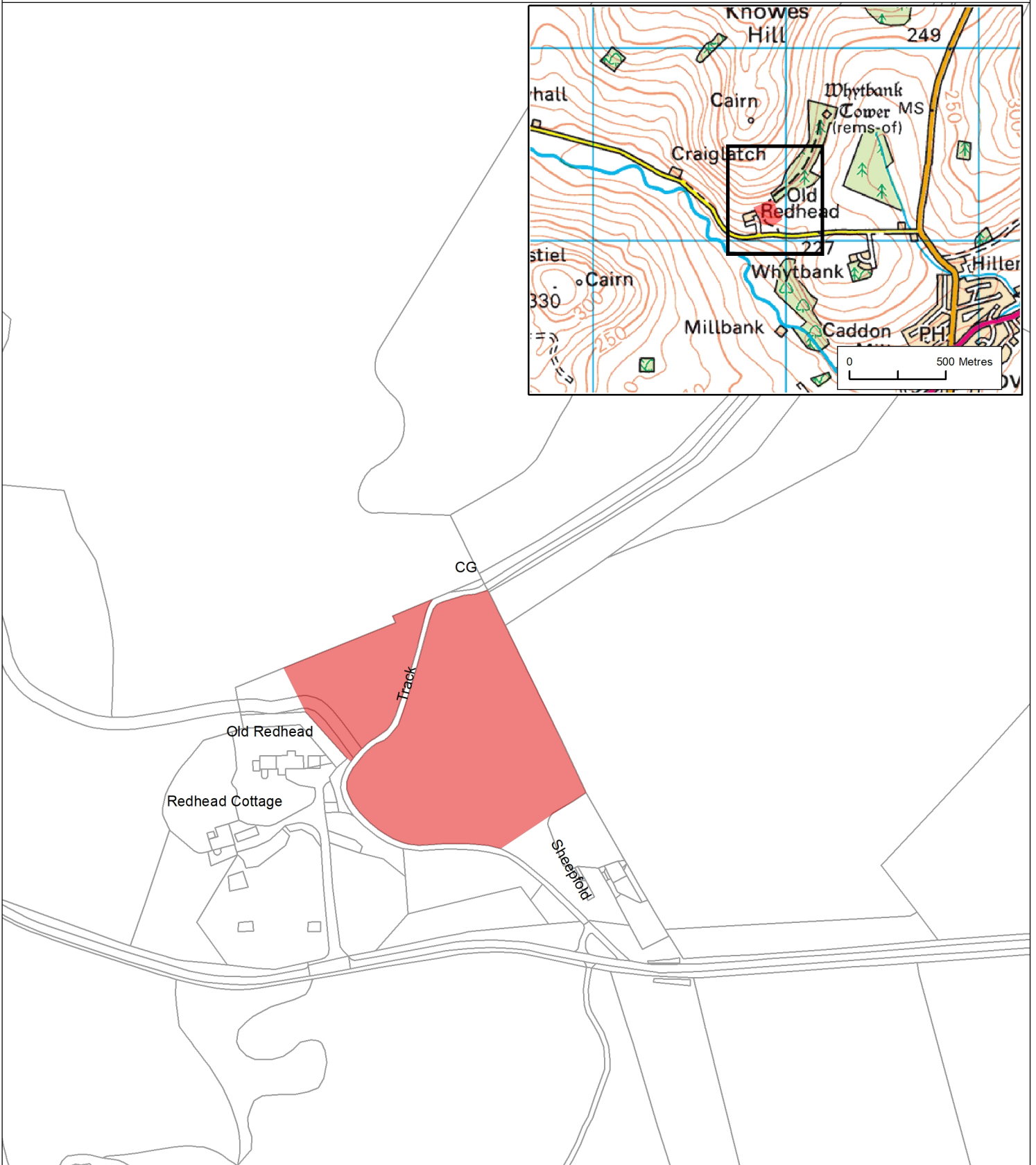
The monument known as **Old Redhead, deserted settlement 15m NE of and 25m ESE of** comprises the remains of a deserted settlement dating to the late medieval and post-medieval periods. It survives as a series of earthworks on south facing slopes above the Caddon Water.

The scheduled area is irregular. It includes the remains described above and an area around within which evidence relating to the monument's construction, use and abandonment is expected to survive. The scheduled area extends up to but specifically excludes the modern post and wire fence on the north side of the monument and the drystone dyke on the east side. It excludes also the drystone wall of the sheepfold on the south side on the monument.

The monument lies in the Parish of Caddonfoot and the County of Selkirk, as shown in red on the plan annexed and executed as relative hereto.
