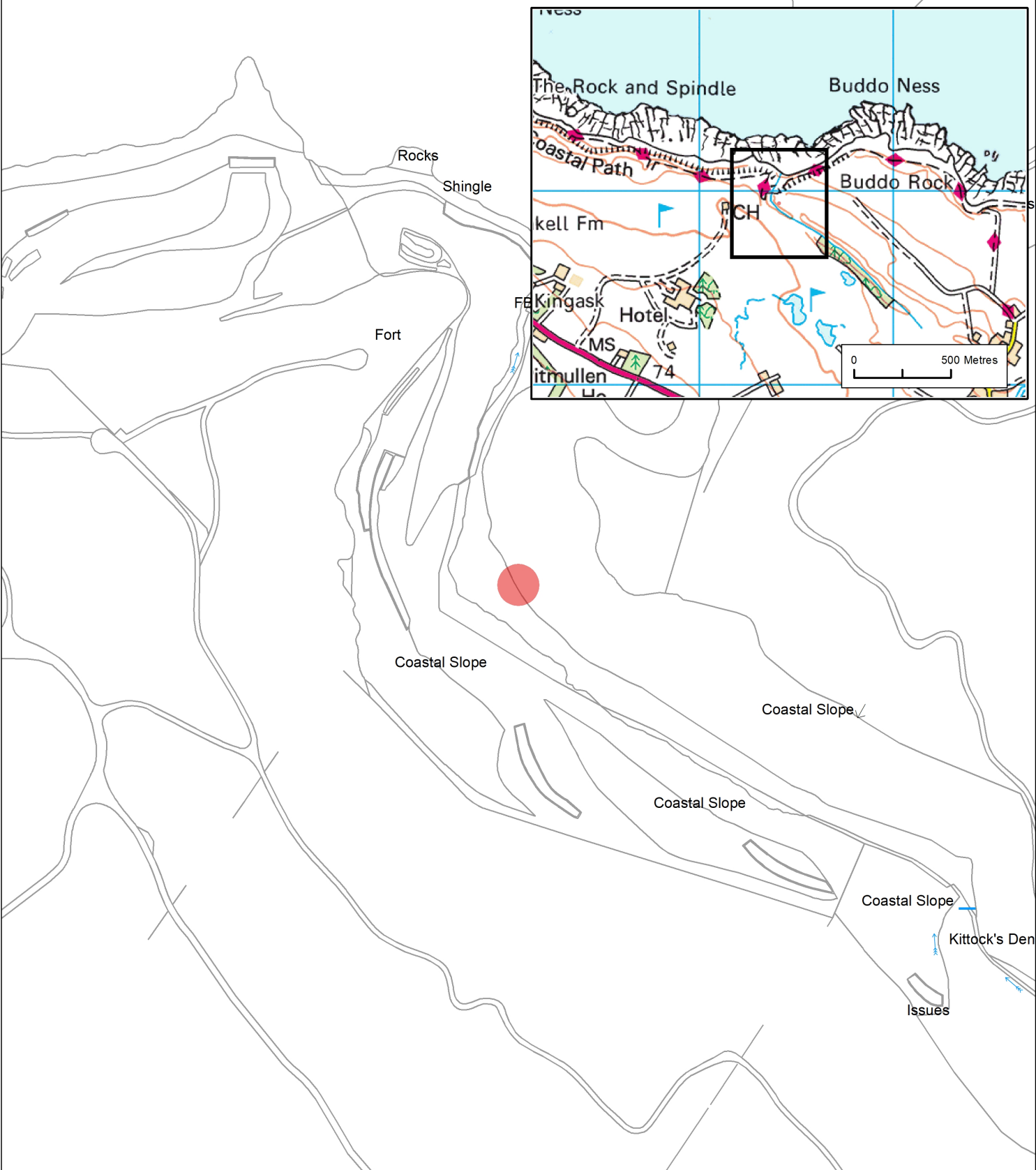
Amendment to the entry in the schedule of monuments

THE ANCIENT MONUMENTS AND ARCHAEOLOGICAL AREAS ACT 1979
ENTRY IN THE SCHEDULE OF MONUMENTS

The monument known as Kittock's Den, souterrain comprises a souterrain (an underground passage and chamber), probably dating from the first millennium AD. Monuments of this type are thought to have been used for storage. The monument comprises a partly rock-cut structure, obscured by dense vegetation growing over it and by roof collapses in two places. The area to be scheduled includes the souterrain and an area around it in which related remains may be expected to survive. It is circular, with a maximum diameter of 20m. The monument, which lies in the Parish of St Andrews and St Leonards and the County of Fife as shown outlined in red on the Plan annexed and executed as relative hereto and which forms part of the subjects registered in the Land Register of Scotland under Title No FFE 26037 [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] is hereby included in the Schedule of Monuments appearing to the Scottish Ministers to be of national importance compiled and maintained by them under section 1(1) of the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act 1979.

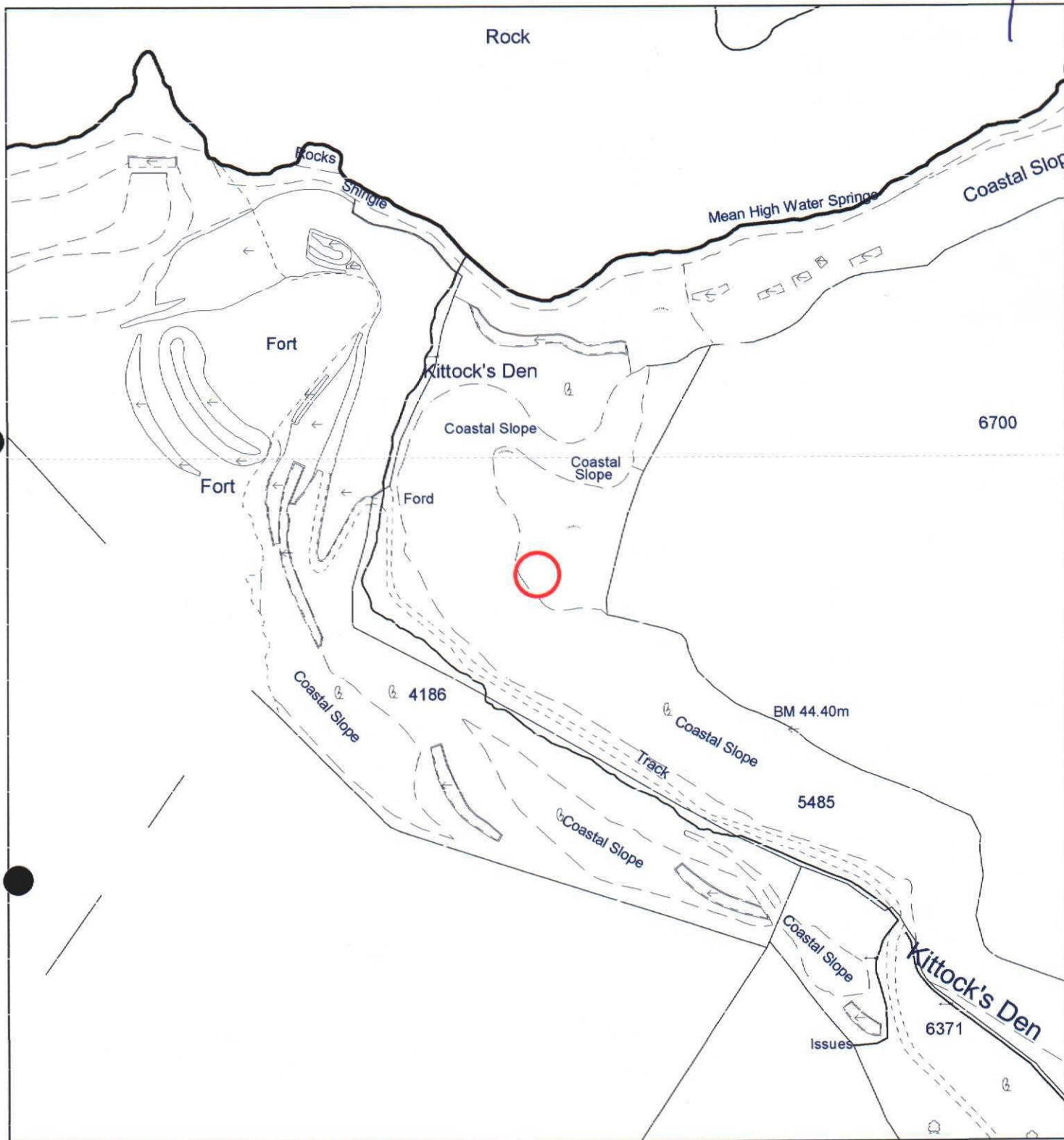
